Re-opening of the River Stort Navigation at Bishop's Stortford, on Friday, 4th July, 1924.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

Guests may travel from Liverpool Street (L. & N.E.R.) by the 4.15 p.m., train reaching Bishop's Stortford at 5.4 p.m.

From the Station they will proceed by way of "The Dells," to the Public Wharf near the Head of the Navigation (about five minutes' walk, see plan annexed), where they will be received at 5.30 p.m. by the Chairman, E. B. BARNARD, Esq., D.L., J.P., the Vice-Chairman, the Right Hon. Sir HERBERT NIELD, K.C., M.P., and the other Members of the Board.

The Chairman of the Board will describe the Stort Navigation, the circumstances under which it was taken over by the Board, and the works which have been undertaken by them.

The Minister of Transport, HARRY GOSLING, Esq., C.H., M.P., will then declare the Navigation to be RE-OPENED.

At the conclusion of the Ceremony, the Members of the Board and Guests will walk by way of The Causeway and South Street as indicated on the plan to the Great Hall, where Dinner will be provided at 6 p.m.
